**English Language Proficiency Policy**

Regardless of country of birth or citizenship, immigrant or nonimmigrant status, all applicants whose first language is not English must demonstrate competence in the English language. Demonstration that English is an applicant's "first" language can be satisfied if the applicant submits a diploma from secondary school (or above) in a system in which English is the official language of instruction. If English is not the applicant's "first" language, the applicant will need to meet the minimum acceptable proof of English Language Proficiency standard.

- Satisfactory completion of English 101 or 102 at an English speaking college or university within the USA, achieving grade 'C or better.
