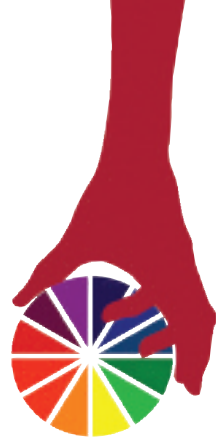

How to Enter

Fill out the Entry & Release form, available at artinstitutes.edu/poster or in the back of this booklet. Then scan the form and email it along with a designer's statement in Microsoft Word format, a current high school transcript, and one poster design to posterdesign@aii.edu. Make sure your email subject line contains your name and The Art Institutes location where you wish to enter the Competition. This will be the location you will represent if you progress in the Competition. Incomplete entry submissions will be disqualified. The Art Institutes are not responsible for any lost, incomplete, or stolen entries. The size of your email must not exceed 10MB.

Entry Requirements & Criteria

To be eligible for this competition you must:

- Show an understanding of the theme "Life Is Better With Art In It" through basic design concepts and a keen eye for design.
- Be a high school senior in the US or Canada (excluding Quebec) graduating in 2009.
- Submit a signed and completed Entry & Release form.
- Create a "Life Is Better With Art In It" poster no larger than 11" x 17", submitted in JPEG format with a minimum resolution of 300 dpi. Compress all files being submitted so that all files together do not exceed 10MB.
- The poster must include The Art Institutes and Americans for the Arts logos, available for download at artinstitutes.edu/poster. The logos must appear in full. Judging points may be deducted if logos are altered.
- Create an entry appropriate for promotional/marketing purposes. Entries deemed vulgar or offensive will be disqualified.
- Submit original artwork. No copyrighted, animated, or team-created work will be accepted. Entries containing copyrighted materials will be disqualified.
- Include a typed designer's statement in Microsoft Word format, explaining the design concept and why you wish to enter the graphic design field.
- A current high school transcript showing a minimum 2.0 GPA must be included with your submission.

The Art Institutes and Americans for the Arts Poster Design Competition ("Competition") is open to legal residents of the fifty (50) United States, the District of Columbia, and Canada (excluding residents of Quebec) who are full- or part-time high school seniors scheduled to graduate in 2009. All winners must meet all school and program general admission requirements. Scholarship awards are contingent upon acceptance to the chosen Art Institutes location and are awarded in the form of a tuition credit. The degree program must be offered at the school that the student represents in the Competition. All tuition scholarships must be used at the location the student represented in the Competition. Tuition scholarships are non-transferable. Upon accepting the scholarship, the winner must begin his or her studies in the summer or fall immediately following the Competition. The winner must maintain a 2.0 GPA or higher during their studies at the chosen Art Institutes location; a GPA of less than 2.0 will result in a loss of scholarship. In the event that the scholarship recipient's education is terminated, either by the school or by the student, the scholarship becomes null and void. Tuition scholarships are not redeemable for cash. The tuition scholarship covers academic tuition and may not be applied against fees, housing, living expenses, or program supplies and may not be transferred between affiliate schools. Scholarship recipients must not interrupt their studies; interruption of studies will result in a loss of the scholarship. Additional restrictions and requirements may apply. National tuition scholarships will be awarded in addition to local tuition scholarships. All decisions made by Sponsor and judges are final and may not be disputed. 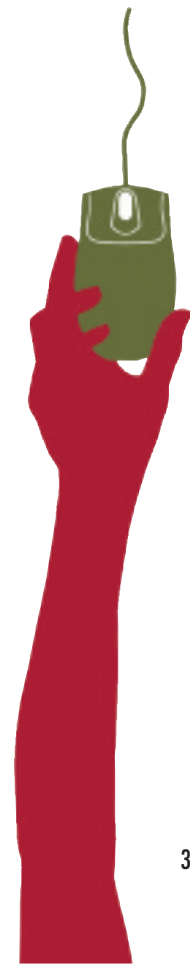
Entry Requirements & Criteria

- Select an Art Institutes location you would like to attend.
- You must be a high school senior graduating in 2009 and a member of the National Art Honor Society.
- Submit six slides of six different original pieces of artwork that represent your creative ability and interest. Digital files may be submitted in lieu of slides.
- Submit a written statement describing your artistic career goals and why you want to be considered for a scholarship.
- Submit your name, home address, and phone number; and school name, address, phone number, and name of your National Art Honor Society advisor.

To validate the scholarship, winners must apply and be accepted to The Art Institutes location of their choice. Upon receipt, all submissions become the sole property of The Art Institutes and will not be returned.

This competition is right for you even if you love fashion but you're not a designer. You can compete in two categories: 1) Fashion Design or 2) Fashion Marketing & Merchandising and Retail Management. Your talent could earn you a scholarship — it's up to you now. 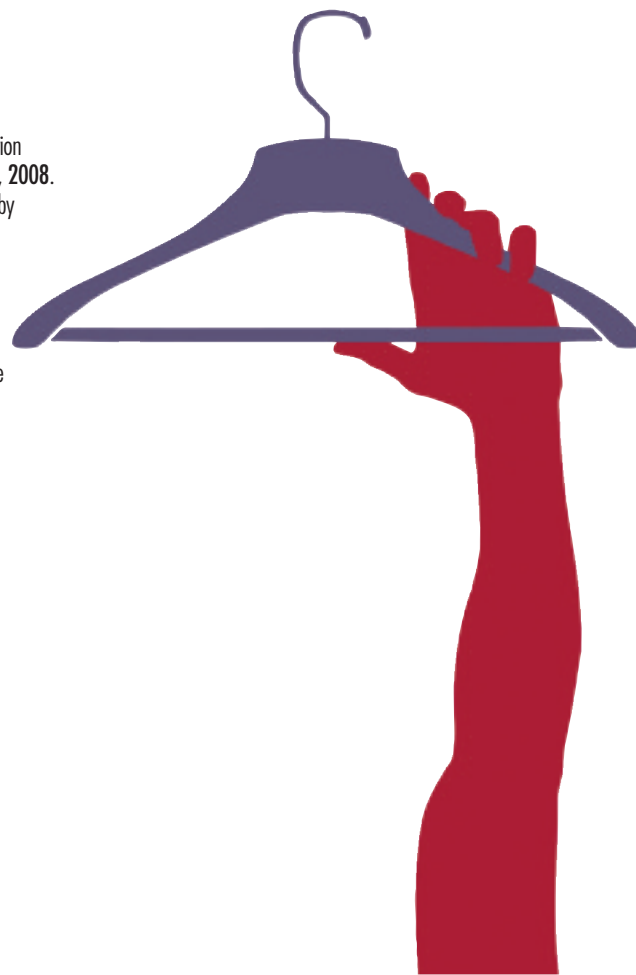
Complete entries must be received by **November 21, 2008** at The Art Institutes location where you plan to enter the Competition and attend. Each local winner will be notified by **December 19, 2008**.

Selection and notification of the national winners will be made by **January 23, 2009**.

How to Enter

Choose from one of two categories: 1) Fashion Design; or 2) Fashion Marketing & Merchandising and Retail Management. Select the category that best matches your skills, then complete all entry requirements for that category. We strongly recommend that entry materials be submitted in one package. Essays and information may be submitted on a CD-ROM.

Mail all entry materials in an envelope with proper postage to The Art Institutes location at which you would like to enter the Competition and plan to attend. Entry Requirements & Criteria

Fashion Design Category

To enter, you must be a high school senior scheduled to graduate in 2009, and you must fulfill all general admission and competition guidelines. This category requires submission of a finished eveningwear garment.

Your entry must include:

- Completed Entry & Release form.
- Your high school transcript showing a minimum 2.0 GPA.
- A short essay (800 words or less) outlining why your fashion entry is unique/innovative and explaining your interest and motivation for a career in fashion.
- A finished, originally designed eveningwear garment product.* The product may be any of the following — shirt (size Medium); pants, dress, or skirt (women's size 8 or men's size 40); or suit, including blouse, pants, or skirt (women's size 8 or men's size 40).
- Process Book (compiled in 8-1/2" x 11" binder), which serves as your design process summary, from original idea to finished product.

The book should include:

1. A written summary of your overall concept.
2. A review of influences on your entry, including fashion designers, music, television shows, or movies.
3. Sketches, illustrations, photographs, or digital images of your project as it evolved from concept to completion.
4. A written summary of people that you contacted for information about your project, including the advice they provided and its influence on you.

* Garment must be your original work. Your finished eveningwear product may be manufactured by an outside source. Examples of eveningwear include full-length gown, cocktail dress, cocktail suit, formal evening suit, blouse/skirt combo, or a jacket/blouse/skirt or pants combo. The Art Institutes (Sponsor) acknowledges that all applicants may not have the same accessibility to materials needed to complete a finished product. As such, unfinished garments may be submitted. However, a completed product will enhance your entry. Should you advance to the national competition, your entry will not be returned. Other entries will be returned by request only. All decisions made by Sponsor and judges are final and may not be disputed.

Fashion Marketing & Merchandising and Retail Management Category

To enter, you must be a high school senior scheduled to graduate in 2009, and you must fulfill all general admission and competition guidelines.

Your entry must include:

- Completed Entry & Release form.
- Your high school transcript showing a minimum 2.0 GPA.
- A short essay (800 words or less) addressing how your fashion creation will contribute to the advancement of the fashion industry, as well as what sparked your interest in the fashion industry.
- A finished and original Fashion Marketing, Fashion Merchandising, or Retail Management product or plan.*
- A written description of your product or plan (1,000 words or less). Entries may include: a retail store concept, marketing promotion, store layouts, fashion business concept, new concept for retail, Internet fashion concept, catalogue retail concept, home fashion concept, or industrial fashion/safety/consumer trend product.

* The Art Institutes (Sponsor) acknowledges that all applicants may not have the same accessibility to materials needed to complete a finished product or plan. Therefore, unfinished products or plans may be entered. However, a completed product or plan will enhance your entry. Should you advance to the national competition, your entry will not be returned. Other entries will be returned by request only. All decisions made by Sponsor and judges are final and may not be disputed.

The Art Institutes Passion for Fashion Competition ("Competition") is open to legal residents of the fifty (50) United States, the District of Columbia, and Canada (excluding residents of Quebec) who are full- or part-time high school seniors scheduled to graduate in 2009 with a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average or the equivalent thereof (based on either a 4.0 scale or 5.0 scale) as of date of entry and prize award. You must fulfill all individual fashion program admission requirements of The Art Institutes school at which you enter the Competition. The degree program must be offered at the school that the student represents in the Competition. All tuition scholarships must be used at the location the student represented in the Competition. Tuition scholarships are non-transferable. Upon accepting the scholarship, the winner must begin his or her fashion studies in the summer or fall immediately following The Art Institutes Passion for Fashion Competition. The winner must maintain a 2.0 GPA or higher during their studies at the chosen Art Institutes location; a GPA of less than 2.0 will result in a loss of scholarship. In the event that the scholarship recipient's education is terminated, either by the school or by the student, the scholarship becomes null and void. Tuition scholarships are not redeemable for cash. The tuition scholarship covers academic tuition and may not be applied against fees, housing, living expenses, or program supplies and may not be transferred between affiliate schools. Scholarship recipients must not interrupt their studies; interruption of studies will result in a loss of the scholarship. Additional restrictions and requirements may apply.

How to Enter

Complete the Entry & Release form and mail it to The Art Institutes location where you plan to enter the Competition and attend. Then by **February 20, 2009** submit to the same school your complete entry as outlined in the complete Competition official rules and regulations at artinstitutes.edu/btc.

Entry Requirements & Criteria

All tuition scholarships are awarded toward a culinary bachelor's degree (if offered at The Art Institutes school the student represented in the Competition), associate's degree, diploma, or certificate program. All tuition scholarships must be used at the location the student has chosen to represent in the Competition. For additional conditions applicable to the Competition and the scholarship awards, please review the complete official rules and regulations at artinstitutes.edu/btc.

The Best Teen Chef Competition is open to legal residents of the fifty (50) United States, the District of Columbia, and Canada (excluding residents of Quebec) who are full- or part-time high school seniors scheduled to graduate in 2009 with a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average or the equivalent thereof (based on either a 4.0 scale or 5.0 scale) as of date of entry and prize award. All entry materials become the property of The Art Institutes and will not be returned. Tuition scholarships are non-transferable. All decisions made by judges are final and may not be disputed.

PROSTART (ADVANCE PLACEMENT CREDITS)

Students who complete the ProStart® program with a C average or above and a certificate of completion may receive advance placement credit at any of over 30 locations of The International Culinary Schools at The Art Institutes. Advance Placement rewards students for their skills, saving them time and money.

Students may receive academic credit up to 12 credits (valued at over \$5,000) for any combination of the following programs:

- Safety and Sanitation with ServSafe® Food Safety certificate
- Elective; Externship; Management, Supervision, and Career Development; Culinary Nutrition*
- Work Experience Credit Reviewed by local school's Chef Director and Dean of Academic Affairs on a case-by-case basis

** Some restrictions apply for approval of Culinary Nutrition credits. See local school for details. Additional credits may be articulated to ProStart students on a case-by-case basis upon review by the local school's Chef Director and Dean of Academic Affairs.*

PROSTART INVITATIONAL

First-place winners of the National ProStart Invitational Culinary Competition and Management Competition will be awarded a \$3,000 tuition scholarship to any one of over 30 locations of The International Culinary Schools at The Art Institutes. A \$2,000 tuition scholarship for second place and a \$1,000 tuition scholarship for third place will also be awarded. How to Enter

Applicants for the scholarship must submit the following information. To simplify the submission process, please enclose as many elements of your application as possible in one envelope and mail it to The Art Institutes school you plan to attend.

- A completed entry form indicating the school and program of study desired.
- An official high school transcript indicating current 3.0 grade point average or higher, and class rank.
- A letter of recommendation from a guidance counselor or teacher.
- A letter of recommendation from an employer, club sponsor, coach, or community service leader.
- A typed resumé stating educational background, extracurricular activities, hobbies, work experience, community involvement, and awards.
- A 200-word essay about your career choice and why you have chosen it.

Entry Requirements & Criteria

The scholarship recipient must begin his or her program of study in the summer or fall quarter following high school graduation. The recipient must not interrupt his or her studies; interruption of studies will result in loss of the scholarship. The scholarship will be suspended in quarters when the recipient's cumulative grade point average falls below 2.5.

All entry materials become the property of The Art Institutes. The judging team is not responsible for loss, damage, or return of entry materials. The scholarship will be awarded only to a student who has been admitted to his or her chosen Art Institutes location. In the event that the scholarship recipient's education is terminated either by the student or the school, the scholarship becomes null and void. The scholarship is not redeemable for cash and may not be used to finance optional programs sponsored by the school. The scholarship may not be applied against fees, housing, living expenses, or program supplies, and may not be transferred between affiliate schools.
