André Leon Talley Speaks To Students

Vogue editor-at-large **André Leon Talley** spoke about his life and career to 100 Fashion Design and Fashion Marketing students at an invitation-only event at the Four Season Hotel on October 30.

A chance meeting between Talley and faculty member **Emil De-John** at the spring fashion shows led to Talley's visit to Philadelphia. Talley's talk was filled with anecdotes, advice and a bit of name-dropping.

"I never forget my roots," Talley told the students. Raised by his grandmother in Durham, NC, the *Vogue* editor recounted his first contact with the world of high fashion at **Andy Warhol's** Factory as well as his days with fashion icon **Diana Vreeland**.

The fashion students were advised to research their favorite designers. "It's not just about a dress; it's about the person behind the label," Talley reminded them. When asked to name "must-know" designers, the *Vogue* editor suggested Carolina Herrera, Christian Dior, Elsa Schiaparelli, Bill Blass and Oscar de la Renta, among others.

The students received a lot of encouragement, too. "You are the future of fashion," Talley told them, singling out students like **Jose Diaz** for taking extra effort to make a fashionable impression at the event.

Talley was also called upon to present two Emil De John scholarships: to Fashion Marketing student **Carl Hildenbrand** and to Fashion Design student **Kevin Coleman**.

Get Ready To Register Online For Winter 2009 Classes!

Yes, it's time to get ready to register online for Winter 2009 classes!

Students will need to **check all HOLDS online** (*see instructions below) as well, so **all students will need an active Login/Password for the stu.aii.edu website!** Students can start checking HOLDS on Friday, November 7 to prepare for Online Registration.

The Registrar's Office asks that students check and print their own Degree Audit online in preparation for registering for Winter 2009 classes. (**see instructions below)

1st, 2nd and 3rd quarter students can see their advisors Week 6 (11/10 - 11/14) and *can start registering online* 8am, Monday, November 10th

Online Registration Will Be Available For All Students Starting 12:01am Thursday, November 13

4th quarter students and above may see their Academic Director for **optional advising**. As students register on-line, it is imperative that they know the scope and sequence of their program and register for appropriate classes. **Students are responsible for knowing prerequisites and take full responsibility for class selections.**

1. Log onto the <http://stu.aii.edu> website using your **Login** and **Password**.
2. At the "Welcome" page, click on "Academic Services"

4. Select the "Holds" icon located under your name
5. If you have a hold, the holding office and reason will appear

** How To Print Your Own Degree Audit:

1. Log onto the <http://stu.aii.edu> website using your **Login** and **Password**.
2. At the "Welcome" page, click on "Academic Services"
3. Click on "Degree Audit" from the left-hand menu options.
4. Click inside the frame with your Degree Audit before printing to be sure the correct frame will be printed.
5. Choose "File" and then "Print" from the Top Menu Bar.

When Registering Online for **Winter 2009**, you will need to update the "Current Option Settings". The Session should be **WI** for Winter and the Year should be **2009**.
